I hope interested neighbors were able to attend the Southeast Conversation event at Taborspace on Thursday, November 16th. Residents from across Southeast Portland came together to share, listen, and learn about safety issues in the neighborhood.

The event aimed to help neighbors learn about actions they can take to feel empowered as neighbors and citizens, and for public servants to gain insights that can be used to prioritize resources and actions. Specific issues compiled from neighborhood association surveys included: unlawful behavior both on personal property and in public spaces; disruptive, aggressive or potentially dangerous behavior in public places; public health issues; and identifying how public officials and neighbors can work together to stretch resources.

The conversation highlighted some specific actions neighbors can take to help improve safety:

- 1. Report everything so the Police can identify hotspots and conduct strategic enforcement (go to www.pdxreporter.org),
- Attend a city council or county commission hearing and advocate during the budget process,
- 3. Vote on bond issues and for increased funding, and
- 4. Contact city commissioners with concerns.

In the meantime, we invite you to attend the Sunnyside Neighborhood Association monthly board meeting, where we will continue talking about these issues, and we will continue to support neighborhood-based initiatives like foot patrols. Let's keep the conversation going!

Join the Sunnyside Tree Planting with Friends of Trees on February 3rd

Have you ever walked down a street in Sunnyside that is lined with big beautiful trees? Perhaps you thought to yourself "How can my street look like this?" It's easy.Plant trees! On February 3rd, we will join our neighbors in the Kerns, North Tabor and Laurelhurst neighborhoods to plant street and yard trees. Our goal is to improve and diversify our urban canopy.

Enhancing the urban canopy is important because trees provide countless benefits to neighborhoods. Trees improve livability by reducing city noise and glare, as well as slowing traffic. They provide habitat for birds and other wildlife. The value of trees increases with each passing year. Houses on tree-lined streets command higher prices than those in neighborhoods without trees.

If you have been thinking of adding a tree to your parking strip or your yard, now is the time. You can sign up for a tree at friendsoftrees.org or by calling 503-595-

0212. The cost of \$35 includes an 8 -12' tree, street tree inspection (ensuring right tree, right place), hole digging, planting, stakes, follow-up monitoring, and information on tree care. The deadline to sign up is January 2nd, and you will need to order your tree by January 16th.

Don't have space for a new tree? Come out and help us plant. Our mission is not possible without the help of volunteers to help plant trees and provide pickup trucks and to transport the trees and tools to the planting sites. We always need pickup trucks! For the past 9 years, the Sunnyside Environmental School (SES) organizes a Holiday / Christmas Tree Recycling Event with all monies raised benefitting the "GO FUND". This fund is utilized throughout the school year to supplement out-of-pocket costs of school field trips for many of our students and families. Our middle-schoolers (grades 6 - 8) earn community service credits by working at the event, neighbors feel welcomed on our school grounds, and we provide a valuable service — particularly for "couch potatoes" and apartment or condo-dwellers.

Remember last January's snowstorm?? Well, we had a few trucks navigating the slick streets, honoring our commitment to provide tree pickup for everyone who had requested it...rain, hail, snow or sun.

As an added bonus, Honl Tree Care turns the trees into mulch chips, helping keep the perimeter school gardens well tended.
