Metro HomeShare

We are a home sharing program that facilitates mutually beneficial matches between home owners with extra rooms and home seekers in need of a safe & affordable room. The home sharing matches often include a service exchange for a slightly reduced rent. The service exchange can include light housekeeping, gardening, errand running, or pet care. (We do not provide personal and/ or medical care). This is a great option for those needing a little assistance around the house or for those who would simply like some companionship. Our typical participant is an older adult or senior who would either like additional income or companionship, or finds themselves on the brink of homelessness due to a challenging rental market. The mutually beneficial relationship of home sharing not only allows for home retention, but also as a way of protecting the most vulnerable Portland residents and allowing them to age in place.

Neighborhood Tree Stewards 2018

Urban Forestry's Neighborhood Tree Steward (NTS) program is scheduled for this fall (September 22nd - October 20th). No previous experience is needed to become a Neighborhood Tree Steward. but you do need a passion for trees, a desire to learn, and the commitment to help. If you have some experience with trees this course will deepen your base of knowledge and provide opportunities for leadership in your community. Through this five-session course. Urban Forestry staff and guest experts will share skills and knowledge to help people care for their neighborhood trees. NTS classes will be both indoors and outdoors and all classes will be held in East Portland's Hazelwood neighborhood.

Participants will learn about:

- Tree identification
- Tree pruning and care
- Tree selection and planting
- · Benefits of the urban canopy
- · Introduction to tree biology
- Equity and environmental justice
- · Portland's Tree Code

The NTS Program is a great way to meet new people while learning the skills and knowledge needed to care for trees. Upon graduation, Tree Stewards will receive a Certificate of Completion and commit to volunteering 40 hours to urban forestry stewardship over the next year.

The cost for the entire course is \$50, which includes all course materials, lunches, and a NTS hooded sweatshirt. Scholarships, childcare and TriMet vouchers are available upon request – no one is turned away because of ability to pay. The deadline to apply is August 8th. What was Sunnyside Neighborhood like in 1910? Part II By Suzy Harris

Neighborhood leaders had "induced the city" to provide a public park and were planning suggestions for its development, going so far as to sue the city to change the approaches to the park from the south "and most important" frontage. (The proposed plat map of Laurelhurst showed 34th street ending at Stark Street, not continuing into the park.) The neighborhood also urged that the pond of water in the park be drained to make room for a playground and baseball diamond. They opposed the creation of the "lake" in favor of a baseball diamond. (That year, Sunnyside had a strong neighborhood baseball team, "winning all of the 14 games played in the East Side division of the Twilight League.")

At the time, on the other side of Sunnyside School (where Sunnyside Park is now), stood a livery stable and a laundry. Neighborhood leaders were working to get the school district or city to purchase this property and remove these businesses to allow for a playground. The newspaper noted that the livery stable had "become so offensive to the

school that the windows in that part of the building must be kept close" and still the odors persisted.

The city was apparently considering changing the name of Sunnyside School to Ladd School (after the pioneer), which the neighborhood leaders opposed. The neighborhood also opposed naming the new park Ladd Park. Of course, the neighborhood leaders preferred "Sunnyside Park", though it was eventually named Laurelhurst Park.

The Sunnyside fire company helped to put out a blaze in Montavilla, "making the long run to Montavilla in less than 25 minutes." (A petition was circulated once again to ask the city to provide fire protection for Montavilla.)
