#### **Just Prune It?**

I'd like to thank the residents of the 20 blocks of Sunnyside that are south of Stark near Laurelhurst Park. More than half of them found a pink survey flagging their tree(s) and a door hanger offering free pruning of their street tree(s) by experienced volunteer pruners. I selected the trees, either young ones that that needed structural pruning or older ones that lacked adequate clearance over the sidewalk or street. Urban Forestry provided the door hangers and pruning tools, but our street tree pruning permit would not let us prune unless the door hanger was signed. It was hard to bypass some of the needy trees where we did not have permission but we did well enough our first day, Saturday April 7th; we pruned 44 trees of the 79 flagged. Excited by the response, I flagged another 61 trees in the next ten blocks and we pruned 37 trees on Friday April 13th.

I'd like to thank Tara Weidner, Peter Elardo, Lizzie Sords and Patrick Key of the Sunnyside Street Tree Team (S2T2) as well as the other Neighborhood Trees Stewards who joined us. I'd also like to thank our neighbors who trusted us with their precious trees, fed us snacks, and in some instances, learned what pruning they will need to do next winter. Lastly, a big thank you to Urban Forestry who provided everything from the paperwork to safety equipment to pruning tools. While many of us have hand tools, many of these trees really benefited from pole saws and pole pruners.

While not every tree was pruned and we could not resolve some issues higher in trees,



#### **Forest to Faucet**

While water from the Bull Run Watershed is considered some of the cleanest in the nation, it still requires treatment to meet federal standards and to provide additional public health protection. Last August, Portland City Council held a hearing to discuss options for compliance with a federal rule requiring water treatment for the parasite Cryptosporidium. City Council voted unanimously to direct the Water Bureau to begin planning for a water filtration facility.

Since then, the Water Bureau assembled a team that has started work on the planning for the 10-year filtration project. Future projects include:

CORROSION CONTROL: Reducing the corrosiveness of Bull Run drinking water to minimize lead in home plumbing from entering drinking water: https://www.portlandoregon.gov/water/76465; and

BULL RUN FILTRATION: Installation of a filtration plant to remove potential

contaminants such as Cryptosporidium: https://www.portlandoregon.gov/water/76429.

The Water Bureau wants to hear from you to help guide initial decisions that will be made on some of the key aspects of the future filtration plant. On Saturday, June 16th from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., the SNA is partnering with the RNA for the 1st annual Richmond Graffiti & Litter CleanUp Day. From a staging area at Central Christian Church at 1844 SE Cesar Chavez Blvd, teams of volunteers will go out to pick up litter on SE Hawthorne Blvd and SE Division St. in the Richmond neighborhood (between SE 29th and 50th/52nd Aves.) and clean up graffiti at residential intersections people have "adopted", as well as at locations along Hawthorne and Division in Richmond.

The RNA is also partnering with SOLVE, KINK Radio's "Paint the Town Green" event, the City's Graffiti Abatement

Program and Keep It Pretty Rose City antilitter campaign, Metro, SE Uplift District Coalition, the Division-Clinton Business Association (DCBA), Hawthorne Blvd Business Association (HBBA), and with Hawthorne and Division businesses such as New Seasons and Fred Meyer.

Graffiti cleaning volunteers will walk Hawthorne and Division and either remove or paint over graffiti on public utility poles with paint provided by Metro.
