Hello Sunnyside

I took an early morning walk through the neighborhood on Wednesday well before dawn. It was peaceful, quiet, chilly, and in many senses, surreal. Early morning is a wonderful time to encounter Sunnyside's sleeping blocks of old houses and otherwise busy Belmont and Hawthorne. It allowed me to reflect on what makes Portland unique, weird, and interesting; reminded me why I fell in love with this city in the first place and also gave me thoughts for this month's newsletter.

Before 5 AM, I walked past Sunnyside park, Sunnyside school, and the Community House. I thought of their unique histories and how they fit into our community today. I have heard from neighbors about the need for recognition of the two sides to the houseless/housed community, and I took some advice to heart given by a neighbor about how we would get further along in neighborhood meetings if these differences are acknowledged. I do acknowledge the need, and I thought it would help to provide some information about the Community House.

The Community House was built in 1922 as an expansion of the Sunnyside Methodist Episcopal Church, but it was designed as a space meant for both the congregation as well as the community. Over the next century, as the worshiping congregation diminished, the Community House continued to provide a gathering space for neighborhood activities.

By 2015, the dwindling congregation voted to end its time together, and ownership of the building was transferred to the Oregon-Idaho Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. But instead of the property being sold to the highest bidder as might happen elsewhere, something wonderful happened. A group of concerned citizens convinced the board to allow the building to continue to serve our community. A Discernment Team was appointed by the United Methodist District Superintendent which has been tasked to "develop a workable long-range plan to assure that the building is not sold to a private party but remains a significant available asset for the people of Sunnyside neighborhood."

This team of nine individuals seeks to create a true Community House that is a legacy for the original congregants and an expression of the Sunnyside Neighborhood Association motto: "Proud Past, Bright Future". Along with providing a space for houseless folks, the Community House, as envisioned by the original congregation, continues to provide gathering spaces for many other neighborhood activities.


Halloween Trinkets and Treats along Belmont
