

Sewer Work Postpones Sunnyside Piazza Repainting Until 2020

Sunnyside The Piazza Sunflower intersection repainting will be postponed this year due to the city's sewer and green street construction along SE Yamhill Street. Construction is set to begin the first week of May at SE 29th Avenue and Yamhill Street, and will go right through the middle of the Sunnyside Piazza intersection over the summer. During this process two large sewer pipes under the road will be replaced. We don't want all our hard work painting the sunflower to get dug up!

Instead, this year the volunteers who help organize the annual repainting will be hosting an intersection "Clean-Up Event" on Saturday June 22nd from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. We will use this time to gather as neighbors and freshen up the Sunnyside Piazza for the summer. Please join us! Please bring your gardening gear (gloves, clippers, etc.). If you would like to donate native flowering plants or step-able succulents, we have a few open spots to fill. We will have some vard debris bins out, as well as compost and mulch for everyone to use. We will also have leftover paint from last year's repainting if anyone would like to paint the garden rocks along the sidewalk. Many of the existing sewer pipes are 100 to 120 years old and deteriorating due to age, or undersized for the sewer and stormwater flows in the area. These improvements will protect public health, property and the environment and reduce the possibility of sewage releases into streets, homes and businesses in the Willamette Watershed.

TREE TRIMMING

To accommodate the large equipment needed to complete the project, arborists have been and will continue to trim street trees and low private trees in the project area. The trimming will remove low branches, to reduce the possibility of large equipment damaging trees and to help ensure public safety.

It's the responsibility of property owners under City Code to maintain street trees adjacent to their property and keep limbs at least 7.5 feet above sidewalks and 11 feet above streets. However, all tree trimming for this project will be done at the City's expense.

Earlier this week, you may have seen arborists trimming street trees on SE 27th Avenue between SE Yamhill and Belmont, as well as along SE 28th Avenue between SE Yamhill and Washington.

The arborists have been or will be trimming trees along SE Yamhill between SE 28th and SE 35th Avenues in early June.

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

Both trenchless and open trench excavation methods were selected for this project. To learn more about these methods, visit www.portlandoregon.gov/ bes/methods.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Noise, Vibration and Dust is significant and will disrupt normal neighborhood activity.
- Traffic Delays will occur in and near the work area. Please observe traffic control signs and follow the directions of flaggers.

- Driveway Access to your property will be maintained, but construction may impact normal use of your driveway or entrance to your business. On street parking will be restricted in and near the work zones to create a safe work environment and to stage equipment and materials.
- Sewer, water, and other utilities will remain in service during construction.
- Equipment Storage: Some equipment and materials may be stored on your street or nearby streets overnight.
- Construction schedule is subject to change due to a variety of factors, including conditions underground, subcontractor schedules, and availability of materials. These same variables may cause periods of inactivity between construction phases.

Sunnyside Community House GNA Draft Complete, But Real Work is Just Beginning

I'm very happy to report that a complete draft of the Good Neighbor Agreement between the Sunnyside Neighborhood Association and Sunnyside Community House has been reached and is available for feedback on sunnysideportland.org (click under "Current Topics"). This draft is the product of over five months of discussion among neighbors with a broad range of views and experience as well as the focused work of a small drafting committee composed of Community House representatives, homeowners from the immediate area, and SNA Board members. Discussions regarding the GNA were also held during several meetings of the Community House's peer support group and paper copies and feedback cards have been available at the Community House for several weeks.

Our hope is to "finalize" the GNA in time for the June SNA meeting, but as important a milestone as this may seem, it is only the beginning of the agreement's real purpose of bringing people together to improve the neighborhood. There is a part to play for all of us, but to be successful that part is likely bigger than it has been, and perhaps different than you have so far imagined. Now that the beginning of a path has been marked by the goals, principles and actions outlined in the GNA, we must shift our focus to creating the communications, logistical and fundraising infrastructure required to give anyone in the neighborhood a way to contribute.
