#### **Oregon State House District 42 Democratic Primary Candidates Forum**

Incumbent representative Rob Nosse and challenger Paige Kreisman will face off in a candidate forum for the Democratic nomination for Oregon House of Representatives District 42. The event, sponsored by SNA, will be held Thursday, April 16th, from 7-8:30 p.m. in the Groves Church Social Hall (3520 SE Yamhill). Candidates will have the opportunity to make prepared statements and field questions from the audience.

#### **Documentary Film Subjects Wanted**

Do you avoid talking to certain family members about politics? Have you been estranged from a loved one due to a difference in religious beliefs? Are you interested in finding ways to have constructive conversations across ideological divides and strengthen relationships?

My name is Travis Brown, and I've been making films in Portland since 2010. I, along with a small team, am making a documentary on the rising social and political polarization that plagues our time and what we can do about it.

Since leaving my religious faith behind, I have been increasingly interested in how

religious and political ideology shape our view of reality, how ideology affects our conversations and what it does to relationships and society as a whole. I'm interested in finding ways to effectively discuss tough issues and doing so in a way that actually strengthens relationships rather than damages them.

So, I am looking for documentary subjects who want to restore or strengthen a relationship with a friend or family member by engaging them in conversation on difficult topics on camera. Our subjects will learn conversational tools from PSU professor Peter Boghossian's book "How to Have Impossible Conversations" and will receive one-on-one guidance from him.

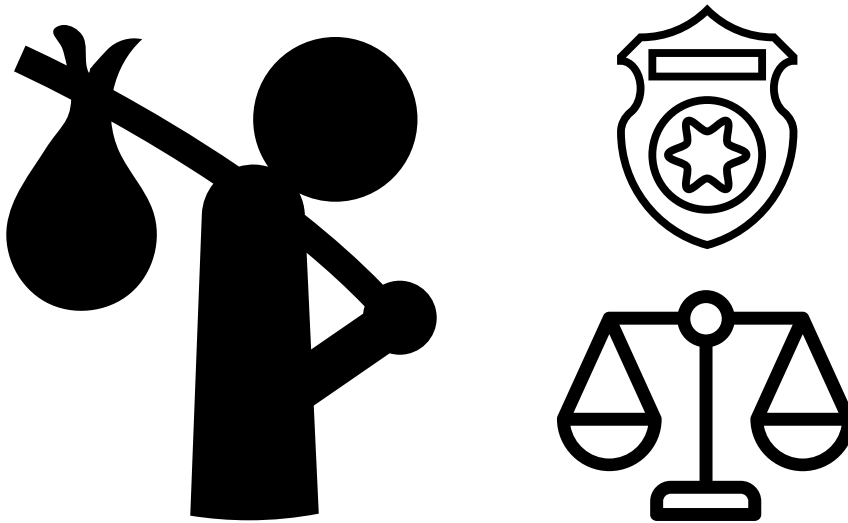

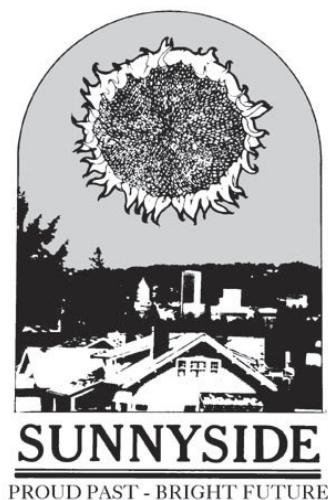
